**SUBJECT:** South Sutter Water District – Hydroelectric Support

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Review and discuss a proposal to provide support for South Sutter Water District hydroelectric operations and provide direction as appropriate.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In 1981 South Sutter Water District (SSWD) signed an agreement with Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) for construction of a 7 Megawatt power plant at Camp Far West Reservoir. Power production started in the spring of 1985. Since that time, SMUD has provided regulatory support, operations, and maintenance of the powerhouse. The SSWD/SMUD contract is coming to an end, and SSWD is looking for options for the long term support with plant operations and maintenance.

As a part of their due diligence, SSWD reached out to Nevada Irrigation District (NID or District) for advice on potential options. During those discussions, the concept of NID operating and potentially providing maintenance and administrative services was developed.

At the December 1, 2020 Administrative Practices Committee (APC) meeting a potential contract was discussed at a high level and the APC directed staff to continue discussions with SSWD to determine if a contract was feasible and in the best interest of the District. Following that meeting staff toured the Camp Far West facility and had several phone calls with SSWD staff.

Staff found the facility to be clean and well maintained however, it lacks the capital investment typical of District facilities. At the site visit and during the follow up phone calls SSWD staff indicated that rather than an agreement where the District is fully responsible for powerhouse operations they would prefer an as-needed type contract with an hourly rate for services.

At the January 5, 2021 APC meeting staff provided the Committee with a draft Term Sheet that did not include pricing information. The Committee reviewed the draft Term Sheet and gave direction to staff regarding pricing, equipment usage, and further negotiations.

Following that meeting staff presented an updated Term Sheet dated January 15, 2021 to SSWD (Attachment 2). Since that time staff has had multiple meetings with SSWD staff and their consultants to discuss a potential contract. Staff believes that negotiations have progressed to the point that this item should be brought to the full Board for discussion.

### Term Sheet

The Term Sheet identifies key provisions that could be used to develop a binding contract. Assuming the Board recommends continuing to move forward with negotiations, staff will work with SSWD to construct a contract which will be brought to the Board for review and final approval.

The Term Sheet contemplates a cost structure that includes a fixed monthly fee and an hourly fee for any services provided. The rates presented are based on the sum of salary, benefits, overhead, and a reserve-building component. The reserve-building component is a percentage of the sum of the first three components as recommended by the APC.

The Term Sheet includes charging SSWD the cost associated with the use of District equipment with a value greater than \$5,000. Equipment rates will help to reimburse the District for a portion of the cost used to purchase the equipment.

### **Expected Level of Commitment**

The Term Sheet makes it clear that operations and maintenance of NID's facilities will be the District's first priority. If at any time staff are needed for NID business they will be diverted from SSWD. Staff currently envisions a level of commitment as follows:

- Operations: 16 hours per month with tasks including routine inspections and flow changes. Limited emergency call out estimated at two to three times per year.
- Maintenance: 16 hours monthly with tasks split between electrical and mechanical/civil crews.
- Compliance, Dam Safety and Administrative: Limited. SSWD expects to handle the majority of these responsibilities.

### Potential Non-Financial Benefits

Staff has identified several District benefits of a potential contract with SSWD beyond the financial benefits contemplated by the Term Sheet.

### In Depth Introduction to SMUD Operations and Maintenance

Working at the facility will allow District staff to review and analyze the manner in which SMUD operates its facilities. During the site visit District staff found the facility to be well maintained. Staff believes the District can benefit from reviewing SMUD's practices at the Camp Far West Powerhouse potentially implementing them at District facilities.

Additionally, staff will be able to further develop our relationship with SMUD personnel which will allow for exchange of ideas which may prove beneficial to the District.

### **Maximization of District Labor and Physical Resources**

As a matter of best practice for a utility, a certain percentage of staff time is expected to be allocated for emergency or other emergent work. During the times when this work is limited, staff time can be maximized for hire at the Camp Far West Powerhouse and would allow the District the ability to utilize its labor resources in the most cost effective way possible.





## Draft Term Sheet

- > Fixed monthly fee plus hourly rate for services provided
- > Access to all job descriptions in NID Hydroelectric Department
- Excludes 24-hour, real-time monitoring and CAISO scheduling
- > As-available basis
- > Two year term but can be terminated with 60 days notice
- Limits liability cost limited lesser of fixed monthly fee or the amount paid for services
- Insurance and Indemnity

# **Expected Staff Commitments**

- Operations: 16 hours per month with tasks including routine inspections and flow changes. Limited emergency call out estimated at two to three times per year.
- Maintenance: 16 hours monthly with tasks split between electrical and mechanical/civil crews.

- Rates will be escalated annually to respond to increase labor and benefit costs. Hourly rate increase shall not exceed 5% annually.
- Labor rates include the cost of hand tools with a value less than \$5,000 and other non-capital equipment used during the performance of work as well utility costs, incidental printing and copying, and computer software.
- Capital equipment used during the performance of services shall be billed in full day increments at the following rates:
  - Fabrication Equipment (e.g. mill, lathe, ironworker) -\$382.00/day
  - Hydrography Equipment (e.g. flow meters, other measuring equipment) - \$70.00/day
  - o Welding Equipment (e.g. TIG welder) \$142.00/day
  - General Electrical Test Equipment (e.g. thermal imager, TTR tester, power quality analyzer) - \$119/day
    - Specialized Electrical Test Equipment (e.g. Doble High Voltage Substation Analyzer) - \$600/day
  - o Remote Operated Vehicles (e.g. Deep Trekker) \$586/day
- All equipment used during the completion of services must be used by a qualified NID employee and is not available for rent.

### Services NID Available to Provide

- "Operations" tasks may include:
  - Routine inspection and documentation of Camp Far West Powerhouse and Camp Far West Dam
  - Call out (emergency) response to issues at the powerhouse or dam
- "Compliance" tasks may include:
  - Standard Project documentation and communications with Project regulators.
- "Maintenance" tasks may include:
  - Equipment troubleshooting
  - o Preliminary diagnosis of fault/failures
  - Recommendations for maintenance and/or replacement schedules
- "Dam Safety" tasks may include:
  - FERC/DSOD regulations including Owner's Dam Safety Program, Dam Safety Surveillance Monitoring Program/Report, Emergency Action Plan, etc.
  - Review of consultant drawings, technical specifications or other submittals.
- "Administration" tasks may include
  - o Representation at local/regional member groups.
